

# Health Conditions We Treat

## Arterial & Vascular

Health Conditions	Treatment Options
<b>Peripheral Artery Disease (PAD)</b> - Peripheral artery disease is a narrowing of the arteries that carry blood flow to the legs. Left untreated, PAD can possibly result in gangrene or amputation.	<b>Angioplasty</b> <b>Atherectomy</b> <b>Stent Placement</b>
<b>Varicose Veins/Chronic Venous Insufficiency (CVI)</b> - Chronic venous insufficiency is a condition that occurs when the venous valves in the leg veins are not working effectively, making it difficult for blood to return to the heart from the legs. CVI causes blood to “pool” or collect in these veins, this pooling is called stasis.	<b>Sclerotherapy</b> <b>Endovenous Thermal Ablation</b> <b>VenaSeal</b>
<b>May-Thurner Syndrome</b> - A rare vascular disorder in which an artery compresses a vein in your pelvis. This compression usually cause symptoms in the left leg and foot, rarely the right ,and may lead to blood clots.	<b>Venous Stenting</b>

## Women’s Health

Health Conditions	Treatment Options
<b>Uterine Fibroids</b> - A common type of noncancerous tumor that can grow in the uterus causing excessive menstrual bleeding and pain.	<b>Uterine Fibroid Embolization</b>
<b>Pelvic Congestion Syndrome</b> - A condition that causes chronic pelvic pain due to obstruction of the veins in the pelvis draining the ovaries.	<b>Ovarian Vein Embolization</b>

## Men’s Health

Health Conditions	Treatment Options
<b>Benign Prostatic Hyperplasia (BPH)</b> - A condition in which the prostate is enlarged. With BPH, there is an overgrowth of prostate tissue which pushes against the urethra and the bladder, blocking the flow of urine.	<b>Prostate Artery Embolization</b>
<b>Varicocele</b> - An enlargement of the veins within the scrotum, much like the varicose veins that appear in the legs, that causes scrotal pain and infertility. It occurs in about one in six males.	<b>Varicocele Embolization</b>

## Pain Management

Health Conditions	Treatment Options
<b>Frozen Shoulder</b> - Frozen shoulder, also called adhesive capsulitis, causes severe pain and stiffness in the shoulder. Over time, the shoulder becomes very hard to move.	<b>Adhesive Capsulitis Embolization</b>
<b>Osteoarthritis of the Knee (OA)</b> - Osteoarthritis is the most common form of arthritis. Some people call it degenerative joint disease or “wear and tear” arthritis.	<b>Genicular Artery Embolization</b>
<b>Diabetic Neuropathy</b> - Peripheral nerve damage caused by long-term high blood sugar levels	<b>Spinal Cord Stimulation</b>
<b>Spinal Fractures</b> - Compression fractures due to Osteoporosis that can occur from simple movements. Fractures are typically found in elderly patients.	<b>Vertebroplasty</b> <b>Kyphoplasty</b>
